Call to Order

Meeting called to order, quorum of greater than 25 members in attendance.

Overall, a good year thanks to the efforts of our executive and volunteer members. Our membership remains stable at around 140 members. The guild is in a strong financial position, treasurer's report will follow in the meeting.

The wood recovery program has put us in very good shape thanks to Dany Coulombe and his team of helpers. This includes an up-to-date inventory of wood on hand. We have a robust and diverse collection of wood still on hand following a very successful sale. We have future access to logs at Panama Flats in Saanich.

Presentations at our monthly meetings have been great which has led to opportunities for further learning including a "Introduction to Fusion 360 program". Shop tours have been excellent and included a 2-night excursion to Washington for 8 members.

The guild maintains a presence in the local community. Thanks to Phil Maken, Visions in Wood was a big success. We contribute to Camosun College with in-kind donations and a \$500 award for best chair at their upcoming Exposition of Craft and Furniture Design, titled "Intention and Grit" starting June 19, 2024 at 7pm. All are invited to attend the show. Toys for Kids at Christmas provided 300 wooden toys. We are well on our way building bat boxes to help conservation efforts of the Habitat Acquisition Trust. Looking to the future there are things the executive is discussing. We would like to add to our tool crib, which currently consists of a vacuum press for veneering. Perhaps a Festool jointer. We want to explore getting back to donations for high school shop programs and creating a closer relationship with our sponsors to give back to them for their discounts. The executive would like to explore helping members or their estates selling their equipment and possibly a internal guild trade or sale day for their own no longer required equipment.

Tool Crib:

The executive would like to continue to build on the current tool crib which currently consists of a vacuum press for veneering. The goal would be to provide access for members to tools they might need too infrequently to purchase but benefit from access to.
